## Yorkshire History Essay Prize

### Essay Requirements

Essays should be word-processed and printed on one side only of A4, with 1 inch or 2.5cm margins and double-line spacing using a standard 12pt font.

Pages should be numbered but in order to facilitate copying to members of the panel of judges they should not be fastened together in such a way as to hinder photocopying.

The judges will take into account the style and presentation of the essays as well as their historical substance and quality

Illustrations, maps and diagrams are permitted and will not be counted against the word-limits specified below.

### PLEASE RETAIN A COPY OF YOUR ESSAY

Essays submitted for the main Yorkshire History Essay Prize (The Beresford Award) must be no longer than 10,000 words and be accompanied by numbered footnote references (to be inserted at the bottom of the appropriate page) and by a List of Sources and a Bibliography at the end of the work. State the number of words used.

Essays for the Bramley Award must be no longer than 5,000 words and include a List of Sources and/or Bibliography at the close, but footnotes are not compulsory. State the number of words used.

Please give the title of your essay at the beginning and state whether you are entering for the Beresford Award or the Bramley Award.

Essays should be sent by post to the Secretary for the Prize, Claire White, Vice-Chancellor's Office, University of Huddersfield, Queensgate, Huddersfield, HD1 3DH, so as to reach her no later than 1<sup>st</sup> November 2018.
